

Father Donal adds: *“Lent pours the grace of forgiveness into our world, needed individually and as a people. We need to know that God is bigger than any of our sins, wars, violence and hatred.”*

That is a great challenge for us this Lent. It’s important to remember that Lent is not only a time to *give up*, it’s also a time to *give to*, whether that’s additional time in prayer, going to daily mass when we can or helping those in need wherever we may find them. Father Donal Neary reminds us that:

“We remain in the Church because of Jesus Christ. The word of God in his Gospel remains life-giving and strong. Today’s scripture shows us that temptations happen often to take us off the path. So too does the unexpected, and scandals have happened in many of the national institutions. Church life may leave us down and weak, but the spirit who kept Jesus strong in the desert will do the same for us.”

He also offers us this advice: *“A Lenten thing to do could be to read a bit of the Gospel every day. Look up Sacred Space on the web and pray from that. Or Pray-as-you-go. Pray your own favourite Gospels. Read the Gospel to the children. Hear the word at weekday Mass.”*

Lent can sometimes be seen as a negative or challenging time but I think we should focus on the opportunities for renewal and revitalisation that it brings to our lives. And may we be inspired by the example of Jesus in today’s Gospel who was able to resist temptation and was not to be distracted by the temptations of the world. Please keep our three Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) candidates from Donaghmede Parish in your prayers over the coming weeks as they prepare to receive the sacraments at the coming Easter Vigil.

It could be for a few minutes or an hour daily or weekly depending on your commitments. Maybe this is Jesus’s personal invitation to you to enter into a deeper intimacy with Him during Lent.

The practice of putting ashes on the head to mark repentance goes back to Old Testament times but it was Pope Gregory the Great around 600 AD who made it part of the Christian celebrations of the first day of Lent. Ashes are made of the palms from Palm Sunday which are then blessed and placed on the forehead in the form of a cross. Many of you will have received these blessed ashes last week on Ash Wednesday.

The word “Lent” itself comes from *lencten*, which refers to the new season of spring. So it is a time for growth and revitalisation in our lives. Pope Francis reminds us that *‘[Christ] became poor, so that by his poverty you might become rich’*. But what do these words mean to us today? The Pope says “Christ does not reveal himself to us cloaked in worldly power and wealth but rather in weakness and poverty. Jesus *“worked with human hands, thought with a human mind, acted by human choice and he loved with a human heart.”*

When Jesus was baptised in the river

Jordan, he did so because he wanted to be like each one of us. He was in no need of forgiveness or repentance but he chose to share the same journey with us.

This Lent we are invited to share the joy of the Gospel message which is one of mercy and hope. Perhaps our mission is to bring light into the darkness and difficulties of people’s lives and to share with them the hope of the Gospel.

The Jesuit writer Father Donal Neary has written a lovely reflection on Lent where he makes some very worthwhile and insightful points. He says the following:

“The focus of Lent is not on what we give up but on what we are given. We focus our minds on the self-giving love of Jesus which we will celebrate in Holy Week. We allow ourselves believe in this love. Often it’s difficult to believe in the tender love of God. This conquers all else in the world; it is given in the mercy and compassion of God.”
