

surviving children, Marie, Pauline, Therese, Celine and Leonie became nuns. They were all Carmelites apart from Leonie who became a Visitation Sister. According to a leaflet produced by the Carmelite Order:

“Therese told Leonie about the “Little Way” of confidence and love that she had discovered. It resonated with Leonie and she understood and lived it out. It helped her discover God within herself. People have come to pray at her tomb since the 1960s. Her cause for canonisation was opened in 2015.”

When we reflect on St Therese of Lisieux, we may previously have thought of one individual who became a Saint and later a Doctor of the Church. But I think that one of the blessings of these relics coming amongst us this month is to remind us that Therese was from an ordinary, hard working family, who were people of faith and had their ups and downs like everyone else. They certainly show how parents can influence their children on the journey of faith and encourage them to follow the message of the Gospel. We can also see in the Martin family how the sisters certainly encouraged each other and, in particular, how her older sisters were an influence on Therese in joining the Carmelites and how Therese, in her turn, also encouraged Leonie to follow the example of her own spiritual journey.

The relics will be present beside the altar at the closing Mass for the World Meeting of Families which will be celebrated by Pope Francis in the Phoenix Park on Sunday August 26th. They will be back in Whitefriar Street on Wednesday 22nd and Thursday 23rd August and also in other locations in Dublin (including Clarendon Street on Friday August 24th and the morning of Saturday August 25th) after that. If you have an opportunity to go along, I hope that you will find it a prayerful and life giving experience.

St Therese, St Louis & St Zelig Martin

12th August 2018

This week the relics of St Therese of Lisieux (often known as the “Little Flower”) and her parents St Louis & Zelig Martin have begun a pilgrimage around Ireland in preparation for the World Meeting of Families.

I was fortunate to have an opportunity to venerate the relics in the Carmelite Church in Whitefriar Street in the city centre this week. It was a very special moment of faith and it was encouraging to see so many people of all ages present, many of them carrying roses in honour of St Therese.

While St Therese of Lisieux is well known to many of you, her parents are much more recent Saints. They were canonised by Pope Francis on 18th October 2015, the first time that a married couple have been canonised. They certainly provide a very

relevant role model for the World Meeting of Families. Pope Francis made the following remarks at their canonisation ceremony:

“The holy spouses Louis and Zelig Martin practised Christian service in the family, creating day by day an environment of faith and love which nurtured the vocations of their daughters, among whom was Saint Therese of the Child Jesus.”

He went on to say that:

“Each of us, through baptism, share in our own way in Christ’s priesthood: the lay faithful in the common priesthood, priests in the ministerial priesthood.

Consequently, all of us can receive the charity which flows from his open heart, for ourselves but also for others, and become “channels” of his love and compassion, especially for those who are suffering, discouraged and alone.”
