

impression on us and encourage us on our journey of faith. But, it's only with hindsight that we can fully appreciate the benefit of such encounters.

Thirdly, Jesus reminds us that wealth and possessions - as an end in themselves - can be a barrier to faith. Of course, we all need certain things for our daily lives and that's fair enough but I think the issue that Jesus is pointing us towards is that we should not allow the accumulation of wealth to *dominate* our lives. The main goal of our lives should not involve the accumulation of wealth especially at the expense of others. So, we are being asked to be modest with our possessions and live lives that are focused on the values of the Gospel.

Sometimes we can look back on our lives and reflect on the Robert Frost poem, "The Road Not Taken." Could we have made different decisions or accepted other challenges? In the context of today's Gospel, we can imagine that the rich young man must have often recalled his meeting with Jesus and wondered what might have happened had he accepted his invitation. Someone once said to me that we should do our best and let God's grace do the rest. In the challenges of life and the challenges of being people of faith, I think we have to make the best call we can with God's help. In the words of the poet Seamus Heaney we can "*believe that a further shore is reachable from here.*" In other words, our prayers are listened to and God is present in our lives. Gerard Reilly

"Good Master, what must I do to inherit eternal life?"

14th October 2018

In today's Gospel, we come across the familiar figure of the rich young man who encountered Jesus during his ministry and asked him what he needed to do in order to inherit eternal life.

Unlike with the apostles, Jesus did not call the young man directly or select him for ministry. Instead, the young man chose to go over to him. What is also interesting about the story is that the young man decided not to pursue the call of Jesus. We are told that "*he went away sad, for he was a man of great wealth.*"

There are a number of points that can be made about this story. Firstly, he is described as a "young man." So, perhaps he was still not mature enough to take on the challenge of the Gospel. Jesus may have recognised that he was not yet ready for this task. There are many times in our lives when we

may be asked to do something but we may not be ready to take on the challenge. It could be a project at work, school or college or perhaps an opportunity to join a football team or sports club. We may conclude that, while we appreciate the invitation, our resources may not permit us to take it up at that particular time.

Secondly, the young man is one of the few prominent characters in the New Testament who does not accept the challenge that Jesus offers him. Of course, we do not hear about this again, so we have no idea how his life worked out into the future. I am sure we can speculate that the encounter with Jesus did have a profound effect on the young man and most likely altered the course of his life for the better.

Often in our lives, we can meet people who will make a deep
