

Archbishop Martin went on to say that, in reflecting, we should also look forward:

"We look towards the future of the Church in Dublin and in Ireland....the Church had too often become closed in on itself and became marked at times with what Pope Francis called attitudes of aloofness and clericalism that at times in your history have given the real image of an authoritarian, harsh and autocratic Church"

The Archbishop concluded his remarks in a way responding to the great question of today's Gospel: *"Who do you say that I am?"*:

"We learn to know Jesus as the one who revealed to us who God is, a God of mercy and compassion, a God not just of judgment but a God who offers us forgiveness and new beginnings. In the Church we experience hope and renewal."

Let us pray today that we may be given the grace to bring others to Jesus, especially those who may have lost their way or may be in need of help or consolation.

As we return to work, school or college after the summer holidays, it's a good time to ask what "new beginnings" we can nurture in our own lives and how we can build up the church in our own parish community. St Therese of Lisieux wrote about the importance of *"doing small things with great love"*. That may well be quite a good starting point for us as continue on our journey of faith this autumn. **"In the Church we experience

In today's Gospel, Jesus asks a question that each of us will have to answer at some point in our lives: *"Who do you say that I am?"*
"The Christ of God": St Peter's extraordinary profession of faith echoes down to us through the centuries. What would we say if we were asked the same question? If social media (with its preference for short, pithy soundbites) were around in the time of Jesus, this very question and St Peter's subsequent reply, might have appeared on Facebook or Twitter.

Elsewhere in the Bible, the experience of encountering God is described in different ways. We are told in the Book of Kings that Elijah was able to identify God in a gentle breeze. Of course, our own experience of God can be less dramatic than St Peter who knew him literally face to face.

St Teresa of Avila tells us that she looked for God everywhere and finally found him within herself. So,

let us ask ourselves today who we say Jesus is and what he means to us in the different circumstances of our own lives.

The poet Patrick Kavanagh once said that *"God is in the bits and pieces of life."* At Mass, Jesus is present in the community of faith who are gathered, in the Word of God and in the Eucharist.

Speaking in Lourdes his week, Archbishop Diarmuid Martin said: *"We gather in the remarkable atmosphere of peace and serenity that is the mark of Lourdes. It is a time for each of us to reflect on what is deepest in our hearts as believers. We can stand back from our everyday concerns and reflect on the special protection that Mary, Mother of the Church, offers our Church and us."*

Not all of us have the opportunity to travel to Lourdes but we should allow ourselves time to pause now and then and "smell the roses", so that we can thank God for the gift of his renewing presence in every aspect of our lives.
