

that Lent is not only a time to *give up* it's also a time to *give to*, whether that's additional time in prayer, going to daily mass when we can or helping those in need wherever we may find them.

Lent can sometimes be seen as a negative or challenging time but I think we should focus on the opportunities for renewal and revitalisation that it brings to our lives. And may we be inspired by the example of Jesus in today's gospel who was able to resist temptation and was not to be distracted by the temptations of the world.

Depending on our circumstances, there are many ways that we can renew ourselves and also reach out to others in the coming weeks. We can allow more time for prayer perhaps at the beginning or end of each day or we can attend mass when we can (and remember, for those parishioners who cannot attend in person, that all our masses are available on the internet through our parish website).

In this message for Lent 2020, Pope Francis gives us the following advice: *"Keep your eyes fixed on the outstretched arms of Christ crucified, let yourself be saved over and over again."* He goes on to say: *"the more fully we are engaged with his word, the more we will experience the mercy he freely gives us. May we not let this time of grace pass in vain."*

Pope Francis concludes by offering our Lenten observance to Our Lady in a very special way: *"I ask Mary Most Holy to pray that our Lenten celebration will open our hearts to hear God's call to be reconciled to himself, to fix our gaze on the paschal mystery, and to be converted to an open and sincere dialogue with him. In this way, we will become what Christ asks his disciples to be: the salt of the earth and the light of the world"* (cf. Mt 5:13-14).

The practice of putting ashes on the head to mark repentance goes back to Old Testament times but it was Pope Gregory the Great around 600 AD who made it part of the Christian celebrations of the first day of Lent.

Ashes are made of the palms from Palm Sunday which are then blessed and placed on the forehead in the form of a cross. Many of you will have received these blessed ashes last week on Ash Wednesday.

Jesus wanted to be like each one of us. He was in no need of forgiveness or repentance but he chose to share the same journey with us. This Lent we are invited to share the joy of the Gospel message which is one of mercy and hope. Perhaps our mission is to bring light into the darkness and to share with them the hope of the Gospel.

The word "Lent" itself comes from *lencten*, which refers to the new season of spring. So, it is a time for growth and revitalisation in our lives. It coincides with the Season of Spring which is breaking forth in our gardens and hedges. It's a time of hope and discovery, a time for growth and development. It encourages us to reach out beyond our boundaries and to cast out in to the deep.

The Jesuit writer Father Donal Neary says the following: *"The focus of Lent is not on what we give up but on what we are given. We focus our minds on the self-giving love of Jesus which we will celebrate in Holy Week."*
