A retired priest I know, always said that it is important to remember that, "after every Good Friday, there is an Easter Sunday".

I recall Joseph Mary Plunkett's poem especially at this time of the year "I see his blood upon the rose. And in the stars the glory of his eyes." The poem is a reminder of God's presence amongst us and that Christ's suffering will always be remembered and commemorated especially at Easter.

Easter is, at one level, an historic event which took place two thousand years ago but, on another level, it is much more than that. Easter is about Jesus being a continuing reality in our lives as he has promised to be with us always until the end of time. We believe that the risen Lord, who stood among his disciples on that first Easter morning, also stands among us today. As Father Martin Hogan writes, his good news of Easter is that the tomb of death has been transformed into the cradle of new life.

The late Father Stephen Redmond SJ once wrote the words "Easter is forever" which sums this Season up so well. Easter brings about a mysterious "oneness in time" (to use Saint John Paul II's phrase) between the historic events of over 2,000 years ago and the course of the centuries since then right up to our present day.

On this Easter day, let us give thanks to God for the gift of his son Jesus to us and to pray that his redeeming love will sustain us on our journey of faith during the coming Easter Season.

### Easter Sunday

1st April 2018

#### *"He is not here, He is Risen"*

Today we read the dramatic account in St John's Gospel about the events of Easter Sunday morning. Mary of Magdala is the first person to reach the tomb and becomes the first witness of the resurrection. She has been called the "apostle to the apostles" as it was her role to tell St Peter and the other apostles about Jesus Christ rising from the dead.

We are told that "until this moment [the apostles] had failed to understand the teaching of scripture, that he must rise from the dead."

Easter reminds us of the reality of death. Some parishioners may have lost loved ones during the past year. When Mary of Magdala made her way to the tomb on that first Easter morning, she was doing so in order to complete the Jewish burial customs. And, initially, she did not realise that Jesus has risen

from the dead. She told the Apostles:

*"They have taken the Lord out of the tomb' she said 'and we don't know where they have put him."*

It was only later in the passage of scripture that she fully understood what had happened and then uttered the great proclamation of Easter Joy to St Peter and St John: "I have seen the Lord!"

Speaking on Easter Sunday last year, Pope Francis said:

*"Today the Church repeats, sings, shouts: "Jesus is Risen!". But why is this? Peter, John, the women went to the Sepulchre and it was empty. He was not there. They went away with their hearts closed in sadness, the sadness of defeat: the Teacher, their Teacher, the One whom they loved so much had been put to death; He is dead. And there is no return from death. This is the defeat. This is the path of defeat, the path towards the sepulchre. But the*

O Happy Day! Resurrection joy is something we do not fully understand: yet every Easter we feel it. It brings with it the assurance of new life and joy in the Spirit.
