To know Jesus, we must know the scriptures and we must come to share in the life that comes to us in the Eucharist."*

We ask for your prayers for the candidates as they continue on their faith journey in preparation for Easter. It's an important moment in their lives and we ask for the prayerful support of the community for them during this time. I see great hope with our parish RCIA programme where we have had 18 adults participating over the past few years. The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) provides an opportunity for people to receive the sacraments later in life and, with their commitment and enthusiasm, to bring new energy to the church.

Archbishop Diarmuid Martin tells the story of a lady who told him that she had seemingly no success in passing on the faith to her own children but she did a great job with two people from South Korea!

It has been a great privilege to be involved with the RCIA over the years and, as can so often be the case, the blessings and graces from being involved are far greater than any effort that was put in. With increasing numbers of people not bringing their children to the sacraments at all in recent years, I am sure that in future years some of them may choose to join the Church as adults. Our experience with RCIA can only help prepare us for what, please God, will be the continued fruits of the programme in the years to come.

At the end of our Second Reading, St Paul reminds us that:  
*"You belong to Christ and Christ belongs to God."*

Let us pray that, through the grace of the Holy Spirit, we will encounter the Risen Jesus in the people that we meet in the week ahead. And also that we will support the children and adults preparing for Confirmation with our prayers.

This is the last Sunday before Lent. We are concluding the reading from the Letter to the Corinthians. When we resume ordinary time in June, we will start reading from the letter to the Romans.

In today's second reading, there is plenty to reflect on. The opening paragraph makes a very important statement about each and every one of us: you are the temple of God's Holy Spirit. As St. Paul reminds us: *"Didn't you realise that you were God's temple and that the Spirit of God was living among you?"*

What an extraordinary claim to make, something that should have deep significance in all our lives. The Holy Spirit is the orientation and focus of our lives, our guiding star and ultimately the well spring of our actions.

This is a particularly important reading as many children in our parish are preparing for the Sacrament of Confirmation. This is an important milestone in their lives as it comes

towards the end of their primary education.

We have two adults in Donaghmede parish who are also preparing for Confirmation as part of our Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) programme. We hope it will be a spiritually enriching experience for the candidates, their families and friends and the entire parish community.

RCIA is the way in which the Church welcomes new members who choose to receive the sacraments as adults. The vision behind RCIA is that the ministry of welcome for new Catholics is the responsibility of all parishioners. It challenges us to be a living sign of the saving embrace of God's love. It encourages us to be welcoming, missionary and familiar with the Word of God as we accompany new members of our Church at the beginning of their journey of faith.
