

must not be content with tiding the poor over the poverty crisis: You must study their condition and the injustices which brought about such poverty, with the aim of a long term improvement".

The people of Nazareth would have known Jesus more as someone who might fix chairs or mend tables rather than curing the sick and announcing the Kingdom of God. It may have been a big jump for them to accept and the gap between the Jesus they grew up with the Messiah he had recently become.

When reflecting to today's Gospel, Father Donal Neary writes:
"Much of the culture today goes against God and religion. Parents cannot fight the culture. But they can hand on the best of the gospel by their own faith and by the way they live their lives, by their love and by speaking the truth as they see it. What is handed on in faith is beyond words."

He adds that:

"Teachers and chaplains play a big role in handing on our faith. The Church owes a huge gratitude to teachers, chaplains, priest and lay, who have held that role in very difficult times over the last number of years."

I would like to mention a book which Pope Francis has written entitled "The Name of God is Mercy". The Pope tells us that "Mercy is the first attribute of God. The name of God is mercy. There are no situations we can't get out of, we are not condemned to sink into quick sand." When describing the calling of Matthew, Pope Francis says "Jesus saw the tax collector and by *having mercy* chose him as an apostle saying "Follow Me." Mercy is therefore key to our Christian calling.

Let us pray today that we will be instruments of the love and mercy in the way we live our lives. And while none of us may have the opportunity to speak in the synagogue in Nazareth, God will give us other opportunities to share his Gospel with those who are willing and open to hearing it.

We have elections to the European Parliament on the way in June. One of the features of elections is that politicians tend to make lots of speeches, some of which are better received than others!

In our Gospel today, Jesus is making a speech on home ground in his native town of Nazareth. This can be seen as the launching pad for his ministry back in his home town.

Jesus quotes directly from the Prophet Isaiah:
"The spirit of the Lord has been given to me, for he has anointed me. He has sent me to bring the good news to the poor, to proclaim liberty to captives and to the blind new sight, to set the downtrodden free, to proclaim the Lord's year of favour."

Father Kieran O'Mahony describes this as "one of the most inspirational passages in the New Testament, underlining, as it does, the gift of the Spirit and the anointing of Jesus as prophet and Messiah."

St Vincent de Paul often quoted this passage "He sent me to bring good news to the poor" (Luke 4:18) as the basis of his ministry among the less well off. St Vincent de Paul got his inspiration from prayer, reflection, his friends and the poor. St. Vincent sent his followers into the streets and among the poor, but he also encouraged them to withdraw and regenerate when necessary.

Later, Blessed Frederic Ozanam who founded the Society of Saint Vincent de Paul wrote: "The poor person is a unique person of God's fashioning with an inalienable right to respect. You
