

fish in this Gospel story are also a metaphor for the people who will be converted through Peter's ministry.

The readings also tell us about the vocations of Isaiah, Saint Paul and Saint Peter. And, while we immediately think of vocations to the priesthood, the diaconate and religious life, we should also remember that each and every one of us have our own vocation in life. As Saint John Henry Newman said, God has made us for a definite purpose and that each of us has a special role and path to follow in the eyes of God. Pope Francis tells us that: *"In carrying out our mission, let us draw inspiration from Mary, Mother of Evangelization. May the Virgin Mother help us to say our own "yes", conscious of the urgent need to make the Good News of Jesus resound in our time."*

When reflecting on the nature of vocations, I can recall various nuns and priests that were "home from the missions" for their holidays when I was growing up which might only have been once every three years or so. I was always very impressed by their faith and commitment as well as their dedication to the third world countries where they worked. Also, in hindsight, they came over as happy, contented and fulfilled in their missionary work despite the sacrifices they had to make. They were all a great inspiration to me. Many have already gone to their eternal reward. In this regard, I think particularly of Sister Betty Kennedy of Nazareth House who died this week and I ask you to remember her in your prayers.

Please God, as restrictions ease and our parish life starts to return to normal, we might consider if we are ready to resume a parish ministry or perhaps begin a new one. This is also a time when new volunteers will come forward in our parishes to assist with the liturgy and the pastoral ministry of the church. As in our readings today, we should ask ourselves if God is also calling us in our time to share our gifts and talents with our parish community.

As always, we should remember that small things can make a big difference to people and even a kind word of welcome or encouragement to someone when leaving mass can mean a great deal to them.

Let us pray in the coming week that we may be able to discern about our own calling in the church as Isaiah, Saint Paul and Saint Peter did in our readings today. And may we be inspired by their prayers and example as we follow our own vocations in the church of our times.


*answer in his heart, in silence, but answer*

*'Am I a man, a woman, a boy, a girl of spring or of autumn? Is my soul in spring or in autumn?'*

He added: *"We do not delude ourselves in nostalgias, regrets and*

*laments: we know that God wants us to be heirs of a promise and tireless cultivators of dreams"*.

This is the first Sunday of February and marks the start of the Celtic season of Spring, which began last Tuesday with the Feast of St Brigid on February 1st.



We also have a new Springtime in our Church with Pope Francis who is such a fantastic role model and example for all Christian people. There is a sense of the end of an era as one age of Christianity passes away but also the emergence of a time of transition as a renewed church emerges by the grace of the Holy Spirit.

It is a good time to think again about our work and ministry and to ask Jesus if he is calling us to spread our wings a bit.

When speaking at a General Audience, Pope Francis spoke about the seasons. He asked: *"We are people of spring more than autumn?"*

He went on to explain:

*"I would like to ask now - each one*

Our readings today are all about people receiving a call for mission from God. The first reading speaks about the call of Isaiah who responds in a generous way to God's request: *"Whom shall I send? Who will be our messenger?"* I answered, *'Here I am, send me.'*

In the second reading St Paul recalls his own conversion and how *"last of all he [Jesus] appeared to me too."* In our Gospel reading, St Peter has a moment of divine revelation when he declares *"Leave me, Lord; I am a sinful man"* when he realised the great power of God in his life. The
