

about today's Gospel:

"The people of the gospel felt foolish that they had not brought oil with them to light their way. The oil is prayer and our relationship with Jesus. This is the essence of the Christian life. Our Christian life is following a real, loving person: it is an invitation to get to know Jesus, and to find ourselves drawn from our hearts to follow him."

Father Donal also adds this comment quoting from St. Ignatius of Loyola, the founder of the Jesuits:

"Ignatius of Loyola's famous prayer is the prayer of the follower of Jesus; 'Lord, teach me to know you more, love you more and serve you more faithfully in my life.' (Spiritual Exercises). The more indicates that this is never a finished product: like love and friendship it grows in our lives. It is exciting that Jesus is never gone from us: risen from the dead he is always alive, always new."

Today's Gospel certainly presents us with a challenge. You may be familiar with the term "God of surprises" and I think that is what Jesus is saying to us today: to be ready for surprises. Sometimes when children are asked what Christmas present they would like, they might say "a surprise". So, our prayer this week may be to ask God to help us to be ready for the surprises he may have in store for us whether it's a new challenge on our journey of faith, the opportunity to help those in need or an unexpected moment for prayer in the coming weeks as we start to prepare for Advent and Christmas.

And let us also take time to thank God for the surprises he has sent us in our lives so far and for the many blessings he has given us.

Today's Gospel is the parable of the bridesmaids and it reminds us to always be ready for what God may have in store for us in the future.

Father Kieran O'Mahony makes the following remarks about this Gospel reading:

"At this point in the Liturgical Year, the lectionary turns to the end of time and to the teachings on watchfulness. Our parable today is unique to Matthew, although there are passages in Mark and Luke which resemble it in some way (see below Mk 13:33-37 and Lk 12:35-38)."

Father Kieran adds:

"While the parable has clear end of time applications, it can also be applied to any moment of grace. It

reminds us that moments of grace come unexpectedly, and we need to be awake to receive them."

Some of us may think that the wise bridesmaids were not so generous by being unwilling to share their oil with the others who had none. On the face of it, not the most Christian of responses.

Father Kieran makes this point:

"We may be tempted to judge the wise bridesmaids as being selfish for not sharing with the others, but perhaps Jesus is teaching us that there are some things that other people cannot provide for us. We have to acquire them ourselves."

"Today, we might feel it was a bit mean of the wise bridesmaids not to share with the others. The point lies elsewhere: there are some things in life no one else can do for us. Becoming wise is surely one of those."
