In our second reading today, from the Book of the Apocalypse, Saint John presents us with a vision of heaven. He says: "I saw the holy city, and the new Jerusalem, coming down from God out of heaven, as beautiful as a bride all dressed for her husband." Saint John goes on to explain further: "Here God lives among men. He will make his home among them; they shall be his people, and he will be their God...there will be no more death, and no more mourning or sadness."

It is said that, towards the end of his life, Saint John always told people to "love one another". This resonates with our Gospel reading today, Saint John quotes Jesus as follows: "I give you a new commandment: Love one another; just as I have loved you, you also must love one another."

It has been said that Jerusalem is the only city which exists twice: both in heaven and on earth. Some of you may have had an opportunity to visit there as part of a pilgrimage to the Holy Land or may be planning to do so in the future. The editor of the *Irish Catholic* has a new book out called *An Irish Guide to the Holy Land* which may be of interest to you if you want to learn more about the part of the world where Jesus lived and carried out his ministry.

The late Stephen Redmond SJ once wrote the words "Easter is forever" which sums this Season up so well. Easter brings about a mysterious "oneness in time" (to use Saint John Paul II's phrase) between the historic events of over 2,000 years ago and the course of the centuries since then right up to our present day.

It may surprise you to learn that the Season of Easter is the longest Season in the Church's year. It lasts for 50 days from Easter Sunday to Pentecost, surpassing the six weeks of Lent and also Advent and the Season of Christmas.

As we go forward with this Season of Easter, may we be inspired by the gift of God's mercy and forgiveness and thank God for his presence amongst us. As Pope Francis says, it is our job to be instruments of God's mercy to others. Let us seek out opportunities in the coming days to reach out to those in need of mercy and compassion and to assure them of God's presence in their lives. And let us thank God for the inspiration of the church artists like Harry Clarke who help to illuminate our journey of faith.

When describing the calling of

Matthew, Pope Francis says "Jesus saw the tax collector and by having mercy chose him as an apostle saying "Follow Me." Mercy is therefore key to our Christian calling.

This was a very humble gesture for someone who had contributed so much to the stained glass of our churches in the twentieth century. During this Season of Easter, it's a good opportunity to reflect on the saving power of God's redeeming love for us all. This is reflected in the Divine Mercy devotions which we celebrated recently on the Sunday after Easter.

Pope Francis recently said "Never fear the final judgement because Christ will always be at our side."
