with the family for several months and it was great to see all the support they got from parishioners.

I first became involved with RCIA about 10 years ago shortly after we moved to Donaghmede. I could never have anticipated that 17 people (so far!) would have taken part in the programme over subsequent years. I would encourage every parish to be welcoming to people who choose to become part of our faith community, so that we can share our experience of the Christian life with them and, through this experience, receive many blessings ourselves.

Today's Gospel is a beautiful touching story of the bringing back to life of a young girl. In the middle of the story, Jesus also finds time to heal an older woman who had been ill for years. Father Kieran O'Mahony explains:

"The double story is known as the "sandwich technique" and is fairly typical of Mark's writing. There is a profound symbolic meaning in the contrast between the mature woman and the young girl. The stories are also found in Matthew 9:18-26 and Lk 8:40-56."

It is interesting to note that both stories are about women at very different points in their life journey but both are in need of healing. Their encounters with Jesus bring this about and they are then able to carry on with their lives.

The message here may be that we too can encounter Jesus at different points in our lives and these encounters will give us the encouragement and energy to go off in new directions.

I would like to wish you all God's blessing for a happy and enjoyable summer and I hope that you get some time off for refreshment and relaxation.
