


Month of November




St. Padre Pio

Month of the Holy Souls

30th October 2022

During the month of November, which begins tomorrow, we especially remember the faithful departed who have gone before us to God. It's often called the Month of the Holy Souls when we especially remember those we knew in life and also those who may have no one to pray for them.

Many people choose to commemorate their deceased family and friends by adding their names to the parish Altar List of the Dead. It's an important tradition to maintain every year as those whose names are on the Altar List of the Dead are remembered regularly at masses throughout the year.

Both Pope Benedict and Pope Francis have tried to explain the meaning of life after death within the limitations of our language and understanding. I hope that their reflections below will offer some consolation especially to those amongst us who may have lost a friend or family member in the past

We continue to keep in our prayers the people of Ukraine

year and are particularly feeling their absence around now.

When speaking about the next life

in 2012, Pope Benedict XVI said: *"Death opens to life, to eternal life, which is not an infinite duplicate of the present time, but something completely new."*

In a beautiful reflection, Pope Benedict goes on to explain that: *"Our hope, then, lies in the love of God that shines resplendent from the Cross of Christ who lets Jesus' words to the good thief: "Today you will be with me in Paradise" (Lk 23:43) resound in our heart."*

He reassures us that: *"This is life in its fullness: life in God; a life of which we now have only a glimpse as one sees blue sky through fog."*

Pope Francis took up the same theme as his predecessor when he was speaking in Rome at a General

Audience he said:

"Paradise" is one of the final words pronounced by Jesus on the cross, addressed to the good thief."

In his poem "To Autumn", the poet John Keats called this time of the year the "season of mists and mellow fruitfulness". Autumn is time for the harvest when we gather the corps into barns. And so it is for our faithful departed as we gather to remember them during the month of November and pray for them as we offer the harvest of their lives back to God.

Saint John Henry Newman in his poem "The Dream of Gerontius" describes the soul, approaching heaven, as it sees something of the divine vision:

"A grand mysterious harmony: It floods me, like the deep and solemn sound of many waters."

Pope Francis has said:

"[Heaven] is the embrace of God, infinite Love, and we enter thanks to Jesus, who died on the cross for us. Where there is Jesus, there is mercy and happiness."

Pope Francis also assures us, as St Paul did, that always "love abides":

"In that instant, finally, we will no longer need anything, we will no longer see in a confused way. We will no longer weep pointlessly, because everything is passed; even the prophecies, even knowledge. But love no, that remains. Because "love abides" (cf 1 Cor 13: 8).

Let us continue to pray for and remember our faithful departed during the month of November and be assured that they are praying for us as well.

Pope John XXIII was once asked if he prayed for the dead. He replied: *"I often think of the departed, they keep me good company."*

I think this is a very good way of looking at it as we know that those who have gone before us are also with us in spirit. Let us ask for the grace in the coming weeks to experience the consolation of God's presence as we reflect on the lives of those who have inspired and helped us in life and are now enjoying the rewards of their goodness with the Risen Lord in heaven.

There is an unbroken chain of connection with our beloved dead, who continue to pray for us in the presence of God, and ourselves as we continue to pray for them. We can be especially close to them during when we celebrate mass when our deceased relatives and friends are always remembered in the Eucharistic Prayer. May they rest in peace. Amen.
